The Master of Education in Educational Administration and Leadership (EDAL) offers students opportunities to explore, experience and develop greater awareness and capacity in educational leadership in contexts of Indigeneity and equity.

Created in partnership with the VSB and SD38, this Masters cohort emphasizes intergenerational capacity building, cross-departmental contributions and scholar-practitioner community engagement and land-based learning opportunities toward fostering educational leadership for Indigeneity, equity and inclusion.

Indigeneity, Equity and Inclusion

This graduate program aims to foster an intersectional understanding of anti-oppression and leadership in ways that are aligned with the VSB and SD38's emphasis on issues of Indigeneity, equity, social justice, and inclusion as well as on the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's (TRC) calls for reconciliation in relation to Indigenous peoples and communities.
